This role will be responsible for facility maintenance support (regulatory interface), Voluntary Clean Up Program (VCP) compliance submittals (including cap inspections and reports), National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) and Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMR), permit tracking and compliance support, as well as supporting construction and development projects.
